



Proposed new City social housing Allocations Scheme – have your say

The City of London Corporation (the 'City Corporation') is holding a public consultation on its proposed new Housing Allocations Scheme.

This scheme will decide how all social housing on the City Corporation's 12 estates across London is let to:

- tenants who want to transfer
- those on the City Corporation's Housing Register.

Why are we making these changes?

- 1. We need to adapt to recent changes in the law and market conditions.
- 2. Given the limited supply of social homes, the proposed scheme is also designed to ensure that those most in need are prioritised.
